Servant's Room: Women's Resource Center: The Women's Resource Center, located at 209 McNeel Lane in North Platte, is a Pregnancy Help Center with the mission to Empower individuals to make informed life choices. As clients build relationships with caring peer counselors, they benefit from free and confidential services ~ Parenting classes, Pregnancy tests, Limited OB Ultrasounds, Options counseling, Community Resource Referrals, Abortion Recovery, and other Life Skills training. Clients also benefit from a Boutique filled with maternity and infant supplies.

Den: Buffalo Bill Corral of Westerners, Friends of Buffalo Bill: A Nebraska non profit corporation dedicated to preserve and perpetuate the memory of William F. Cody and to study the history and lore of the area. Current President of Friends is original member from 1978 Judy Herbst Brown. Gary Phipps of Sutherland serves as Sheriff of the Corral.

Dining Room: North Platte Chamber Hostesses: Hostesses work to support and promote programs that are beneficial to the local community and the North Platte Area Chamber of Commerce and Development Corporation.
